Design Your World: STEM Conference for Girls

Dallas SWE hosted two Design Your World events in FY16. The first was in November 2015 at Southern Methodist University where 150 4th and 5th grade girls, 80 adults, and 80 volunteers enjoyed a day of fun and learning! The girls participated in activities about polymer plastics, wearable LEDs, 3D animation, robotics, and car racing. Adults attended the Parent and Educator Panels, with tips and advice on encouraging girls to pursue STEM.

The second DYW event was held in April 2016 at University of North Texas Discovery Park. Attendees included 150 middle and high school girls, 40 adults, and 84 volunteers. The girls learned about robotics, computer programming, biomedical tech, Future City

designs, and energy efficiency. Parents and educators discussed college admissions and STEM topics with a panel of engineers. Each of these events culminated in a fashion show of models from local SWE sections dressed in the "uniforms" of their various professions.

Additionally, the DYW events held in FY15 won the SWE Region C Award for Best Joint Professional and Collegiate Event and the SWE Outreach Award for Parents and Educators Event at the Society level for the second year in a row!
